

APPLICATION STEPS

Step 1: Enroll at TSA

The Sharon Academy has an open enrollment policy. We are certified to meet the needs of all students and enrollment occurs on a first-come, first-serve basis until the class is full. To enroll, please email enrollment@sharonacademy.net.

Step 2: Fill out a FAST Application

FAST (Financial Aid and School Tuition) is a secure, third-party financial aid processing service TSA and many independent schools use to determine financial need. Fill out the FAST Financial Aid form on FAST's Website. All information TSA receives on this form will be held in the strictest confidence.

Step 3: Complete the Pat Woodin Scholarship Application

Please complete this application and return it to Enrollment Manager, at enrollment@sharonacademy.net following the submission of your child's other enrollment materials.

The application involves three components:

- A series of questions to be completed by the student.
- A series of questions to be completed by a parent.
- · A teacher recommendation
- Optional: Additional recommendations from adults (non-parents/quardians)
- Optional: A list of extra curricular / out-of-school activities and interests

SPECIAL EDUCATION

As of July 1, 2023, TSA is approved to receive students on any special education plan. TSA also accommodates eligible students with disabilities in accordance with and to the limits of state and federal laws, including, but not limited to, Section 504 of the Rehabilitiation Act of 1973. Please notify us after you have submitted the enrollment form if your child is or has been on an IEP, a Section 504 Plan, or an Educational Support Plan so that we can coordinate the implementation of placement and program with TSA staff, you as parents, your student and/or the sending school district. We'd welcome your questions before enrollment as well on how we can best support your student at TSA. You are in no way required to disclose information before enrolling. Our hope is to create a communication system where conversations about your student's need can be ongoing pre-enrollment through to graduation.
